ESSENCE OF

TAMIL NADU PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT, 1997

RAGGING MEANS

- a. Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear, shame or embarrassments to student in any educational institution;
- b. Teasing, abusing of, playing practical jokes or causing hurt to such students;
- c. Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course willingly do;
- 2. Ragging in colleges is a cognizable offence (i.e, a Police Officer can arrest without warrant);
- 3. Ragging within or without any educational institution is totally prohibited;
- 4. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend up to Rs.10,000.
- 5. Any student convicted of an offence under Section 4 shall also be dismissed and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.
- 6. Whenever any student complains of ragging to the head of an educational institution or to any other person responsible for the management, such person shall enquire into the same immediately and if found true, shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.
- 7. If the head of the educational institution or the person responsible for management of the educational institution fails or neglects to take action when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have acted the offence or ragging and shall be punished as provided for in Section 4 of TNPR Act, 1997.

A BRIEF BACKGROUND

Christ College of Arts and Science were established in 2008 by the Archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore in Tamil Nadu, to promote higher education among the rural poor. It is a co-educational institution, approved by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Tamil Nadu and affiliated to the University of Madras. The College was started with the specific purpose of serving the socially marginalised, economically backward and politically powerless, rural poor girls and boys, who would otherwise not have easy access to the University Education.

Kilachery village, 50 kms away from Chennai city, to its west, was chosen for establishing this institution for good reasons.

- The area is a fast developing industrial zone, promising abundant career opportunities.
- The village borders three rural districts of Thiruvallur, Kancheepuram and Vellore and so an apt location to cater to the educational needs of these backward districts.
- Seventy villages around Kilachery have 20 large Public Higher Secondary Schools with thousands of students who would normally drop out after school education but now Christ College provides them an opportunity to pursue job-oriented higher education.

ELIGIBILITY

UG: Candidates for admission to the first year of the Bachelor's Degree courses shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary Examinations (Academic or Vocational Stream) conducted by the Government of Tamil Nadu or an Examination accepted equivalent by the Syndicate of the University of Madras.

PG: The college follows the norms and the syllabi of University of Madras and conducts the semester end University Examinations.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

- Application form for admission into Christ College should be obtained from the College office and should be submitted within the prescribed date.
- 2. Duly filled-in application should be accompanied by the following certificates:
 - a. Original transfer certificate (TC)
 - b. Original higher secondary (or) degree mark sheet
 - c. Two copies of the transfer certificate
 - d. Two copies of higher secondary / degree mark sheet
 - e. Copy of SSLC mark sheet
 - f. Copy of community certificate

 - h. Copy of income certificate
 - i. Copy of ration card
 - j. Copy of aadhaar card
 - k. Fitness certificate from a registered Medical practitioner
 - I. Two copies recently taken passport size photographs
 - m. Original first generation graduate certificate from Thasildar
- 3. The admissions are made on the basis of first-come-first-served and the number of seats in each course is fixed by the University.
- 4. Those who apply for Transfer Certificate without completing the full course should pay the whole fees for the full course (three years for UG and two years for PG).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

COLLEGE HOURS

UG 09.00 am to 01.30 pm PG 09.00 am to 01.30 pm

OFFICE HOURS

The College Office functions from 08:30 a.m. to 04:30 p.m. on all the working days. Request for certificates, testimonials and other documents requiring the Principal's signature should be addressed to the Principal and submitted to the College Office. Certificates will not be issued without a minimum of 48 hours prior notice.

CONDUCT

Students are expected to maintain discipline and conduct themselves in a manner becoming of a student in order to uphold the honor and dignity of the institution.

DRESS CODE

Students are expected to wear simple and modest clothes, avoiding sleeveless blouses, tights, short tops, flimsy cloths, etc. Salwar Kameez is most desirable. Boys are instructed to dress in formals. No short pants is allowed. Students arenot permitted to participate in fashion shows, modeling or talk shows and other TV programmes without prior permission from the Principal.

FEES REGULATIONS

- 1. Every student must pay the total fee for the Semester on time.
- 2. The fee once paid cannot be refunded.
- 3. Any student who wishes to discontinue for any reason, will have to pay the Full Course Fee in order to obtain Transfer Certificate.

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

- A student who has been convicted of any offence in a criminal court will not be allowed to continue his/ her studies in the college.
- 2. Students should abstain from active participation in party or communal politics.

- 3. Students who indulge in political propaganda or who organize fellow-students into political factions in the premises of the college or who otherwise engage themselves in party politics are liable to be expelled from the college.
- 4. Students should not include in any activity that leads to the disruption of peace, discipline and normal work in the college. Students found in violation of this rule, will be severely dealt with.
- 5. Ragging is strictly forbidden. Anyone who involves in ragging will be severely dealt with. Students who are guilty of:
- a. Rude language towards the staff of the college, or
- b. Assault or attempt to assault the staff or fellow students of the college is liable to be expelled from the institution.
- 7. Disobedient students will be referred to the college Discipline Committee for further action.
- 8. Students are discouraged from loitering in the campus after 02.00 p.m.
- 9. Students under the influence of alcohol and other intoxicants will not be permitted to enter the college.
- 10. If a staff member by speech or otherwise seeks to mislead his/her students in activities deemed objectionable, he/she is liable to be punished for dereliction of duty.
- 11. Students are not permitted to use mobile phones in the campus.
- 12. The Principal or the management of the college may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary character regulating the conduct of the college that seem necessary to maintain the credibility and reputation of the college.
- 13. The College authorities reserve the right to dismiss any student who does not confirm to the rules and regulations laid down by the college.

RULES OF ATTENDANCE

- 1. 5 marks per paper in every semester are being allotted for regular attendance to the classes.
- 2. Attendance is being taken at the beginning of every class hour.
- 3. Attendance is compulsory on the reopening day, closing day, seminar days, department programs, and industrial visit. Attendance is also compulsory for all the special activities of the college.

- 4. The student who wishes to avail leave for one day has to get permission from the Class Counselor by a written letter, for two days from the HOD and for more days, from the Dean. The students who are absent due to illness should also produce the medical certificate.
- 5. The student can obtain monthly attendance status from the Class Counselor.
- 6. Names of the students who have shortage of attendance will be displayed on the notice board at the end of every semester.

COLLEGE ID CARD

- 1. Every student is permitted into the college campus, class and examination hall only with the College ID Card.
- 2. Loss of College ID Card must be intimated immediately to the office and obtain a duplicate ID Card by paying the fine of Rs. 100.

CHANGE OF RESIDENCE

The student shall report to the office whenever he/she change his/her residence.

TUITIONS

The faculties are not permitted to take tuitions outside the college without the permission of the Principal. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate this rule.

CO-OPERATION OF PARENTS

Parents are welcome to come and discuss about progress and problems of their children with the teaching staff of the college and the Principal with prior appointment. They are requested to co-operate with the college authorities to enforce regularity, punctuality, discipline and academic excellence in the interest of the students. They are also expected to attend 'Parents Meet' without fail.

COLLEGE PROPERTY

Any damage to college property by way of scribbling, splashing colours, breaking furniture etc., will be dealt with severely. The cost of repairs and replacement will be borne by the offender.

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

The College follows the same Semester system of the University of Madras.

- 1. Each semester has two periodical tests, two assignments, one seminar, model exam and attendance as part of the internal assessment(25 marks Theory Paper).
- 2. Semester end University Exam (75 marks Theory Paper).
- 3. University Practical Exam is conducted at the end of each semester (100 marks).
- 4. 85% of attendance is compulsory to appear for University Exam.
- 5. All the eligible students who appear for the examination for the first time in any semester should pay the examination fee in full for all the subjects whether the candidate writes the examination or not.
- 6. Students reported of malpractice in examinations will be severely dealt with and even dismissed.
- 7. No student who is admitted to college is automatically eligible for the university examination. At his discretion the principal, may direct any student to withdraw from the examination, either due to student's repeated poor performance in studies, or irregular attendance, or indulging in any unwanted activities.

GENERAL FACILITIES

LIBRARY

The LIBRARY is the heart of a learning center. Christ College Library has a good collection of books consisting of reference books, literary works (Tamil & English), encyclopedias, subject text books, periodicals, national & international journals, dailies and CDs/ DVDs of digital books.

Library maintains a BOOK BANK with a sizable number of text books for the use of economically disadvantaged students, who will be allowed to borrow two extra text books for the semester duration.

Library Working Hours : 08.30 a.m. to 03.30 p.m.
Books will be issued during : 11.30 a.m. to 11.50 a.m.
01.30 p.m. to 03.30 p.m.

The following guidelines may be useful:

- 1. Students are encouraged to use the library extensively.
- 2. Each student is given a Library Card soon after the admission.
- 3. A student may borrow three books using the Library card for a period of two weeks and can extend for another week.
- 4. Loss of Library Card must be intimated immediately to the Librarian and obtain a duplicate Library Card by paying the fine of Rs. 100/-
- 5. Borrowers failing to return books within the prescribed period shall pay a fine of Rs. 1/- per day per book.
- 6. Stealing books or tearing pages is a serious offence and will be seriously dealt with.
- 7. Strict silence should be maintained in the library.
- 8. Students are not allowed to bring any printed matter or files into the library.
- 9. Books must not be marked or damaged in any manner.
- 10. Students must examine each book before borrowing and immediately report any damage or missing/loose pages, if any. If they fail to do, so they will be held responsible for any damage detected after their use of the book.
- 11. Students shall replace or pay for the cost of any book lost by them.
- 12. Reference books, periodicals, journals, projects and semester question papers should be used in the library only.

- 13. Students must present their Identity Card before entering the library.
- 14. Students must immediately report the loss of Identity Card to the Office.

COMPUTER LAB

Christ College has well equipped computer labs with sophisticated systems and latest software packages for different educational requirements. It is facilitated with competent technical experts. The college campus is equipped with hi-speed internet connectivity through Fiber Optic Cables. All the computers in the campus are provided with uninterrupted power supply and internet connection to facilitate the undisturbed learning.

The thrust area in Christ College is that every student of the college is given competency in computer skills to fit into the job market. So students are given an opportunity to have easy access and hands-on- experience on computers. Regular computer practical classes are given utmost priority in order to equip the students with needed skill to work with the computers.

- Two Labs for Class Practicals with 50 computers and a LCD projector each.
- Digital Lab consisting of 25 computers with Internet & Intranet facilities.
- Digital Electronic Lab equipped with microprocessors and digital kit.
- Basic Computer Lab for beginners to learn Typing, Data Entry and basic computer skills.
- PG Computer Lab consisting of 25 hi-end computers with all the software as per the requirement.

THE STUDENTS' COUNCIL

The Students' Council and other associations bring dynamism in the college campus. Organizing various functions, competitions, celebrations and events in the college students develop leadership skills, team spirit and organizing abilities.

The office bearers of the Students' Council are; the President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Treasurer; Cultural, Sports, Library, Women Cell and Departmental Secretaries. They are selected by the members of the Staff at the beginning of each academic year. The class representatives are elected by their respective classes.

Students entrusted with the responsibility of an office in the College should endeavor to prove themselves worthy of their task. They should always remember that to a great measure, they should be an example of loyalty and devoted service to their fellow students. They should work closely with the college authorities proving themselves, helpful and co- operative as true member of Christ College. The class representatives are responsible for the order and discipline of the class.

The College looks to the senior students in particular to uphold the culture, standard and tradition of Christ College and serve as a constant example to their juniors.

The functions of the Students' Council are

- On Saturday programs students can wear decent casual dresses.(long frock, sarees, salwar).
- During classes and exams on Saturday students should fallow formal dress code.
