CONFERENCE ON PURE AND APPLIED MATHEMATICS [CPAM – 2026]



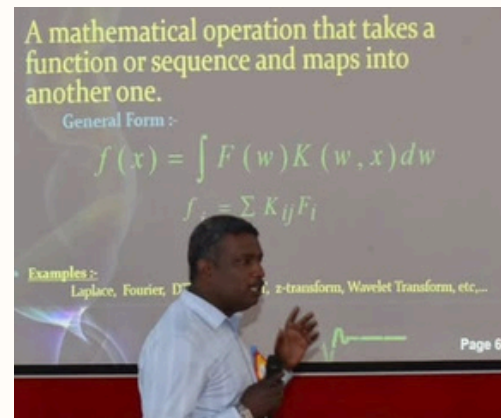
