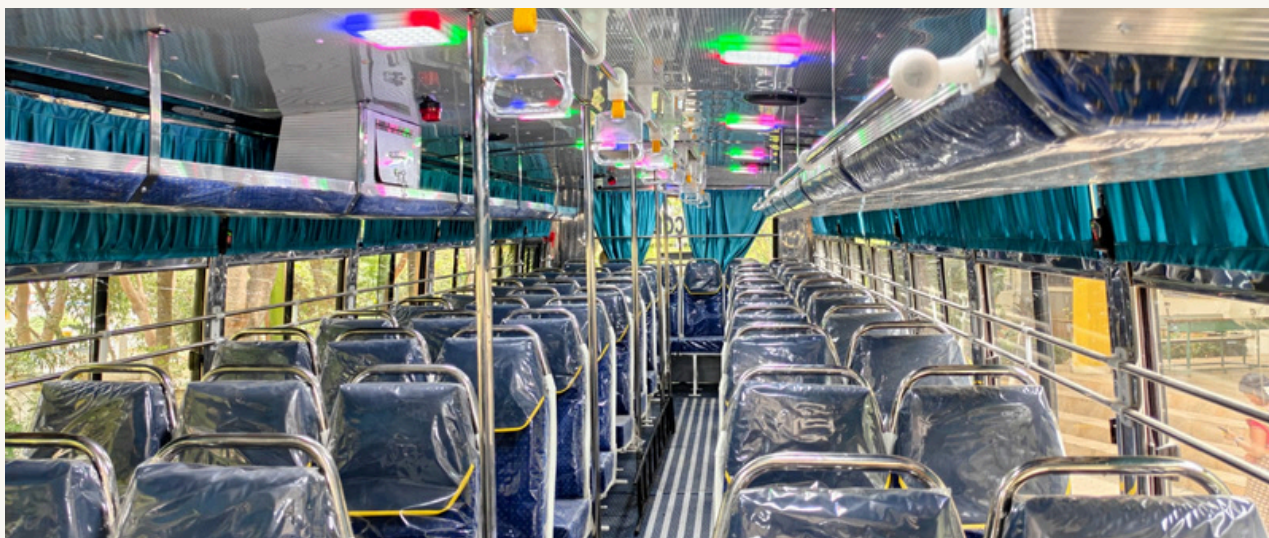

INAGURATION CEREMONY FIRST YEARS



The Student Council organized the First Year's Inaugural Day (2026) on 01 July 2026 to welcome the newly admitted students into the college community. The programme was designed to familiarize freshers with the institution's administration, regulations, responsibilities, and campus culture to begin their academic journey with confidence. The programme commenced at 9.30 AM with an invocation prayer, creating a positive atmosphere. This was followed by the Welcome Address, where the dignitaries and newly admitted students were greeted.

The management, deans, Heads of Departments, and class counsellors were then introduced to the students, enabling the freshers to become acquainted with the institutional leadership and academic support system. A few years ago, Priya's life changed when her father lost his job. Financial difficulties filled her home, and continuing her education seemed nearly impossible. Relatives suggested she leave her studies and find work. Yet Priya refused to give up. Through prayer, hard work, determination, and the support of her family and friends, she continued her studies with courage. Today, she pursues her goals with confidence and inspires many young people facing similar struggles. Her story shows that even in life's darkest moments, a small ray of hope can lead to a brighter tomorrow. Many young people like Priya quietly carry worries and fears that others do not see. Health experts, including the World Health Organization, note that millions face stress, anxiety, financial pressures, academic demands, family concerns, and personal setbacks every day. In the midst of these challenges, what helps a person remain strong when everything seems uncertain? For countless people, the answer is hope.

What Is Hope? Hope is one of God's greatest gifts to humanity. It is more than simply wishing for good things or expecting everything to work out easily. Hope is the confident trust that life still holds meaning and purpose—even when times are difficult. It is not the same as optimism or naivety. Optimism may assume good outcomes without effort. Naivety ig-

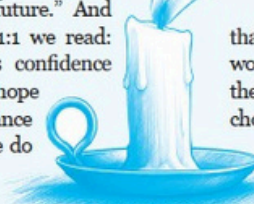
nores problems. True hope, however, faces reality with courage. It accepts challenges but chooses to keep moving forward with faith and perseverance. Priya did not pretend her family's situation was easy. Instead, she accepted the difficulties and trusted God to guide her. This inner strength can be nurtured in many ways: the loving support of family and friends, healthy habits such as rest and exercise, positive reflection, and professional guidance when needed.

The Christian Foundation of Hope: For Christians, hope grows through prayer, participation in the Church, and trust in God's promises. When asked what helped her during uncertain times, Priya replied, "Prayer helped me trust that God had a purpose for my life. The encouragement of my family and friends gave me strength whenever I felt discouraged." Her words echo the heart of Christian hope. Unlike wishful thinking, Christian hope is rooted in faith in Jesus Christ and God's faithful love. The Bible assures us of this truth. In Jeremiah 29:11, God says, "For I know the plans I have for you, plans to give you hope and a future." And in Hebrews 11:1 we read: "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." God has

a loving purpose for every life. True hope does not depend on perfect circumstances but on the conviction that God is always present, guiding and sustaining us—even in suffering. The Church plays a vital role in nurturing this hope. Through prayer, worship, fellowship, and service, Christians are reminded they do not walk alone. Pope Francis encouraged believers to be signs of hope by showing kindness, compassion, and accompaniment to those who suffer. Pope Leo continues to call the faithful to walk with those who feel discouraged, offering encouragement and support.

A Call to Persevere: Hope does not remove all obstacles, but it changes how we face them. It inspires us to search for solutions, persevere when success seems far away, and believe

that better days are possible with God's help. As the saying goes, "Hope is not waiting for the storm to pass; it is learning to walk through the rain with faith." Priya's experience, like that of so many others, shows that setbacks do not have the final word. When life becomes hard and the future seems uncertain, we face a choice: Will we surrender to despair, or will we move forward with courage, trust in God, and hope? ▲

PROJECT ORIENTATION



The Department of Computer Applications and the Department of Computer Science jointly organized “Code to Career – A Project Orientation Program” on 16.07.2026 to help students connect academic learning with industry requirements. The session focused on project planning, software development methodologies, database management, and emerging career opportunities in IT.

Students gained insights into the Software Development Life Cycle (SDLC), including requirements analysis, design, development, testing, and deployment. The session also compared Waterfall and Agile methodologies, highlighting the importance of iterative development, teamwork, continuous integration, and adaptability.

A major technical focus was on database concepts such as DDL, DML, and DRL, covering database creation and modification, data manipulation, and efficient data retrieval using SQL queries, joins, filtering, and aggregate functions. Through live demonstrations using Python and MySQL Connector, students learned how applications interact with databases and the importance of secure database connections and parameter handling.

The resource persons encouraged students to develop practical, problem-solving-oriented academic projects rather than relying on standard templates. They highlighted industry expectations such as clean coding, Git, teamwork, problem-solving, and knowledge of emerging technologies including Cloud Computing, Artificial Intelligence, and API development.

Students found the session highly informative and motivating, particularly appreciating the live Python-MySQL demonstrations and insights into Agile project workflows. The resource persons appreciated the students’ enthusiasm, participation, and thoughtful questions, and encouraged them to continue experimenting with emerging technologies and strengthening their technical and problem-solving skills for successful IT careers.

CRISTA III BSC CS



The students of III B.Sc. CS conducted the CRISTA assembly titled "Expedition Unknown" on 08.07.2026 at 9.00 a.m.

The objective of this session was to create awareness about the challenges faced by girls and women in society, including online abuse, safety, women empowerment, and financial independence. The Vachathi case refers to the atrocities committed in 1992 in Vachathi, a tribal village in Dharmapuri District, Tamil Nadu, during a raid by forest, police and revenue officials. The villagers faced severe violence, destruction of property, and sexual assault of 18 women. In 2023, the Madras High Court upheld the conviction of 215 officials, more than three decades after the incident. The students presented the incident with sincerity and explained the events and their impact throughout the session. The session concluded by highlighting the denial of justice near three decades and ended with the National Anthem.



NSS-SCHOOL CLEANING
